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Weekend to Remember® Prayer Guide
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Friday evening is an introduction to the weekend. You will meet the weekend's speakers who will show you exactly how to pursue a marriage that really works through stories of their own breakthroughs and blunders.

INTRODUCTION

Praise the Lord! We praise God that you have been called to take "the sword of the spirit, which is the word of God" (Ephesians 6:17b ~ NIV) and pray for those attending the Weekend to Remember®. You will need your Bible in order to pray effectively for these couples.

This Prayer Guide is filled with the Word of God for you to declare as you intercede for those attending this conference. When you pray Scripture for these couples, you are imparting the life and power of God. As you enter the world of intercession, you place yourselves on the front battle line for God. In order to combat spiritual attack, one MUST be prepared. Begin now by reading Ephesians 6:10-18 and by taking up the armor of God.¹

Each day you will be using the acrostic **PRAY**.

You will begin each day or session (depending on how the prayer team is scheduled) with **Praising** God, **Repentance** from sin, **Asking** God anything according to His will, and **Yielding** yourself to all that God will speak to you. You may then use the specific message guides to target your prayers.²

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Praise: Praise is acknowledging God for who He is. You may even choose to praise through song. Included in praise are prayers of thanksgiving for what He has done.³

Repentance: It is necessary to approach God in an attitude of repentance. None of us is without sin (1 Kings 8:46). "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." (1 John 1:9 ~ NASB)

Asking: "This is the confidence which we have before Him, that, if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us. And if we know that He hears us in whatever we ask, we know that we have the requests which we have asked from Him."

(1 John 5:14-15 ~ NASB)

Yield yourself to God: Spend time quietly sitting at His feet and listening for His voice. He will guide and direct your prayers.

PRAISE AND THANKSGIVING

Shout for joy to the LORD, all the earth.

Worship the LORD with gladness; come before him with joyful songs.

Know that the LORD is God.

It is he who made us, and we are his;

we are his people, the sheep of his pasture.

Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise; give thanks to him and praise his name.

For the LORD is good and his love endures forever; his faithfulness continues through all generations.

-Psalm 100 ~ NIV

Praise the LORD! Praise the LORD, O my soul!

REPENTANCE AND CLEANSING

Out of the depths I cry to you, O LORD! O Lord, hear my voice! Let your ears be attentive to

the voice of my pleas for mercy! I wait for the LORD, my soul waits, and in his word I hope.

Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me.

- Is there anyone you have not forgiven?
- Did you fight with your spouse or a family member or anyone else today?
- Is your life self-controlled or God-controlled?

ASKING

The following subjects are general areas to "ask" God for each time you begin to pray.

INVITATION: Invite the Holy Spirit into the conference, the hotel, ballroom, guest rooms, hallways, elevators, couples, and hotel staff (John 14:25-26 and John 16:5-11). Ask the Spirit of Unity to be among all those attending and working (Psalm 133 and

Ephesians 4:3-6).

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SPEAKERS: Declare speaker-couple's names. Pray that the speakers would be refreshed and filled with His Holy Spirit and anointing. Also pray that they will be sensitive when teaching and sharing life applications (Romans 12:1-21; Colossians 1:9-12a).

My message and my preaching were not with wise and persuasive words, but with a demonstration of the Spirit's power, so that your faith might not rest on men's wisdom, but on God's power. ... This is what we speak, not in words taught us by human wisdom but in words taught by the Spirit, expressing spiritual truths in spiritual words.

GOD'S PURPOSE: Pray that God's purpose will be accomplished in each person attending. Pray that God will direct couples of His choice to be in attendance.

THE COUPLES: Pray that couples would ask the question, "What does God have for us?" Pray that they begin to investigate what God is saying to them through 1 John 1:7—to walk in the light of Jesus, so that we may have unbroken fellowship with Him and with one another. Pray that His kingdom will come to their hearts and to their homes! Pray for safety in traveling. Pray for peace and protection for children at home.

TEACHING TRUTHS: Pray that the teaching truths will be clear and that the Word of God will penetrate deep into their hearts. Pray confidently that it will accomplish the work that God intends and will not return void. 1 Corinthians 2:4-5,13 ~ NIV MAKING IT PERSONAL: Pray that each individual will approach these 'One Minute to Oneness' and Projects with humility, integrity and honesty.

A prayer for yourself and those attending might look like this:

Lord, enable all of us to honor you by submitting to each other (Ephesians 5:21). Give us patience, faithfulness, and encouragement; and help us to live in complete harmony with the attitude of Christ toward each other (Romans 15:5). Keep us vigilant to guard against any separation of spirit between us.⁴

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YIELDING

I trust you, Lord, from the bottom of my heart; I will not attempt to figure out everything on my own. I am listening for your voice in everything I do and everywhere I go; you're the one who keeps me on track (Proverbs 3:5-6).

ATTITUDES (Philippians 2:2-5): Pray for those with a rebellious attitude—those who don't want to be there—that the strongholds would be taken away (broken) and replaced with a willingness to listen. Pray that God's Holy Spirit would be allowed to minister to their hearts throughout the conference. Pray that the deeds of the flesh will be broken and that the fruit of the Spirit will prevail (Galatians 5:16-26).

TRANSITION FROM THE WORLD TO LISTENING TO GOD'S WORD

(1 Peter 5:6-7; Psalm 51:16-17): Pray that the men and women would be able to cast all of their cares and concerns unto the Lord (Matthew 6:25,33). Pray as they walk into the hotel that they will feel the peace of the Holy Spirit. Pray that hearts will be tender and eager to learn and apply the biblical principles to be presented.

COMMITMENT TO THE APPLICATION PROJECTS (Hebrews 13:17): Pray that couples will be committed to complete each **Application Project.**

UNDERSTANDING: Pray that the couples would understand the lessons and desire to know how to apply them to their lives. Pray for protection of their minds from distractions and from fleshly thoughts (2 Corinthians 10:3-5). Pray: "So faith comes from hearing, and hearing by the word of Christ" (Romans 10:17 ANASB). Pray that they will have ears to hear the Word of God.

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This manual is designed so that you, our Prayer Team, have a copy of the FamilyLife Weekend to Remember® current sessions to review/reference and/or focus on the Prayer Directives and Scripture that are after each sessions notes and pray the scriptures there.

Couples, as individuals, will rate their "Scale of Isolation...to Oneness"

When our Dreams are challenged, we can do one of three things:

- 1. Give up on our dreams
- 2. Get out and find a new dream
- 3. Grab hold of a better dream

We believe there is a God who has a bigger vision for our marriage than we probably had for ourselves.

What if...

- You could learn how to move closer together when you feel isolated in marriage?
- You could have the marriage you will want your kids and grandkids to have?
- Your marriage could make a difference in the world?

Remember: No Marriage is static. You are either drifting toward isolation or moving toward oneness.

Prayer Guide for Prayer Team Members Session 1: Are You Living The Dream?

We all come into marriage with a picture of what "happily ever after" looks like

Main Teaching Truths:

- Why did you fall in love with each other?
- When did your fantasies about marriage hit reality?
- What three options comfort us when our dreams don't match reality?

Prayer Directives and Scripture

- Pray for the couples who have not arrived yet—for peace and protection from the enemy. Pray against discouragement and for them to persevere through any obstacles the enemy has put in their way to arrive at the conference.
- Pray that the Lord will break down the walls in their hearts and that there will be much laughter.

A cheerful heart is good medicine. Proverbs 17:22a ~ NLT

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 Pray that each individual will not harden his/her heart to the Holy Spirit and will receive correction through the conference speaker's teaching.

Today, if you hear his voice, do not harden your hearts.

Psalm 95:7b-8a ~ NIV

Let a righteous man strike me—it is a kindness; let him rebuke me—it is oil on my head. My head will not refuse it.

Psalm 141:5a ~ NIV

 Pray that God would peel away the layers of deception and that each person would see themselves honestly.

For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any doubleedged sword, it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart. Nothing in all creation is hidden from God's sight. Everything is uncovered and laid bare before the eyes of him to whom we must give account.

 Pray for each couple to recognize and confess the threats affecting their marriage—adjustments, our culture's pattern, difficulties, extramarital affairs, and selfishness.

Therefore, confess your sins to one another [your false steps, your offenses], and pray for one another, that you may be healed and restored. The heartfelt and persistent prayer of a righteous man (believer) can accomplish much [when put into action and made effective by God— is dynamic and can have tremendous power]

James 5:16 ~AMP

 Ask God to stir their hearts so that oneness would be the desire of their souls.

Jesus knew their thoughts and replied, "Any kingdom divided by civil war is doomed. A town or family splintered by feuding will fall apart."

Matthew 12:25 ~ NLT

 Pray for couples struggling with depression to seek counsel. Also, pray for understanding if anger turned inward is the root cause of the depression.

How long must I wrestle with my thoughts and every day have sorrow in my heart? How long will the enemy triumph over me? Look on me and answer, O LORD my God. Give light to my eyes, or I will sleep in death. But I trust in your unfailing love; my heart rejoices in your salvation.

 Pray that couples can share their original dreams of marriage expectations, hopes, and desires without fear.

For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind. 2 Timothy 1:7 ~ KJV

 Pray that couples will see the things that cause marriages to drift towards isolation and see what oneness look like.

...and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free.

Part I Session 2: Let's Talk

Good communication is necessary if we want to stay on the path toward oneness

Goal of communication: Build oneness by sharing who you are

Level 1: Cliché: Non-sharing

Level 2: Fact: Sharing what you know

Level 3: Opinion: Sharing what you think

Level 4: Emotion: Sharing what you feel

Level 5: Transparency: Sharing who you are

When we feel safe to share who we are, we have a better chance of experiencing oneness.

Why Does Communication Get Difficult Over Time?

1. Some of us grew up watching communication habits that weren't healthy.

Bad Communication Habits:

- a. Stuffer
- b. Shouter
- c. Interrupter
- d. Rambler
- e. Arguer
- 2. Many of us have different communication styles than our spouse.
 - a. Land the Plane vs. Enjoy the Ride
 - b. Let's Take Turns vs. Thinking Out Loud
 - c. Share Your Feelings vs. Just the Facts
- 3. We tend to discount the role that stress plays in communication.
- 4. We often have unhealthy ways of dealing with anger.

5. We don't intentionally pursue training to help grow our communication skills.

CREATE A SAFE PLACE TO FOSTER TRANSPARENCY

(Are we practicing the two key communication habits that lead to understanding?)

My dear brothers and sisters, take note of this: Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry.

James 1:19 ~ NIV

<u>First</u>, work to listen carefully so you can understand your spouse's heart

- 1. Give focused attention: put away distractions
 - ... listen to me, and be attentive to the words of my mouth
 Proverbs 7:24
- 2. Avoid trying to fix the problem/person
- 3. Try to feel what they are feeling
- 4. Suspend judgment: don't defend yourself
- 5. Summarize what you are hearing
 - a. "Are you telling me...?"
 - b. "Can you tell me more about what you meant when you said...?

A person's thoughts are like water in a deep well, but someone with insight can draw them out.

Proverbs 20:5 ~ GNT

<u>Second</u>, work to express clearly so your spouse can understand your heart

1. **Think** before you speak

If you want to stay out of trouble, be careful what you say.

Proverbs 21:23 ~ GNT

- 2. **Ask** if now is a good time and place: create the right environment
- 3. **Share** your heart: pains, fears, hopes, desires, disappointments
- 4. **Beware**: Anger can sabotage vulnerability

The words of the reckless pierce like swords, but the tongue of the wise brings healing.

Proverbs 12:18 ~ NIV

Anger tips:

- i. Pay attention to tone and body language
- ii. Refuse to use mean and insulting words
- iii. Avoid trigger words like "always" and "never"
- iv. Equip yourself with "I feel" when "you fact" language
- 5. **Ask** them what they heard

Pursue God's three purposes for marriage

Prayer Guide for Prayer Team Members Session 2: Let's Talk

Good communication is necessary if we want to stay on the path toward oneness

Main Teaching Truths:

- What did God intend for the first couple to experience in marriage?
- How can each couple make the world a better place?
- What are the keys to experiencing real companionship in marriage?

Prayer Directives and Scripture

 Pray that couples would see their poor communication habits, and how and why communication can become difficult over time.

Words kill, words give life; they're either poison or fruit —you choose.

Proverbs 18:21~MSG

 Pray that couples would create a safe place to foster transparency and share who they really are without the fear of anger.

My dear brothers and sister, take note of this: Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry, because human anger does not produce the righteousness that God desires.

James 1:19-20 ~ NIV

 Pray that couples would work to listen carefully so they can understand each other and understand their spouse's heart first.

...turning your ear to wisdom and applying your heart to understanding—indeed, if you call out for insight and cry aloud for understanding, and if you look for it as for silver and search for it as for hidden treasure, then you will understand the fear of the LORD and find the knowledge of God.

Project 1:

Communicating Oneness: Our Communication Toolbox

May the God who gives endurance and encouragement give you the same attitude of mind toward each other that Christ Jesus had, so that with one mind and one voice you may glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. Accept one another, then, just as Christ accepted you, in order to bring praise to God.

 Pray for understanding of how communication has caused isolation and for open communication about these during the application time.

 Pray for honesty with one another and gentleness in their communication.

A man has joy in an apt answer, and how delightful is a timely word!

Proverbs 15:23 ~ NASB

Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for building up, as fits the occasion, that it may give grace to those who hear.

Ephesians 4:29 ~ ESV

Pray that the Lord would give them ears to hear each other.

There is an appointed time for everything. And there is a time for every event under heaven ... a time to be silent, and a time to speak.

Let every person be quick to hear, slow to speak, slow to anger.

Pray against anger disrupting their communication.

But now you must put them all away: anger, wrath, malice, slander and obscene talk from your mouth. Put on compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. Colossians 3:8,12 ~ ESV

 Pray that they will be discussing their hopes for the weekend. Please pray that the Lord would bring hope to their hearts.

May our Lord Jesus Christ himself and God our Father, who loved us and by his grace gave us eternal encouragement and good hope, encourage your hearts and strengthen you.

2 Thessalonians 2:16,17a ~ NIV

 Pray that there would be vulnerability in expressing their hope. Pray that they would dare to hope for His purposes for their marriages.

For I know the plans I have for you, declares the LORD, plans to prosper you and not harm you, plans to give you a hope and a future.

Jeremiah 29:11 ~ NIV

Part I Session 3: The Forgotten Dream.

God's original design for marriage is better than our best dreams for marriage

Where did the idea of oneness in marriage originate?

"Therefore, shall a man leave his father and his mother, and shall cleave unto his wife: and they shall be one flesh." Genesis 2:24 ~ KJV

<u>Fast Fact:</u> The Bible starts with a marriage (Genesis), dedicates an entire book in the middle to marriage (Song of Solomon), and ends with a marriage (Revelation)

<u>Path to Oneness</u>: Pursue God's Three Purposes for Marriage:

The first purpose is to model the unity of God to those around you.

So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him, male and female he created them Genesis 1:27

- 1. God created human beings uniquely— "in His own image"—to reflect some of His character qualities: i.e. His truth, wisdom, love, kindness, ability to think, feel, and know right from wrong.
- 2. Marriage is God's original and unique context to reflect something about God that you can't do on your own.
- 3. Marriage brings two distinct beings (a man and a woman) together so that we may "image" or reflect a God who is three (Father, Son, Holy Spirit) and yet one.
- 4. When marriages model His unity, though mysterious, people are more apt to believe that Jesus Himself is God.

The glory that you have given me I have given to them, that they may be one even as we are one. I in them and you in me, that they may become perfectly one, so that the world may know that you sent me and loved them even as you loved me.

John 17:22-23

Therefore a man shall leave his father and mother and hold fast to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh. This mystery is profound, and I am saying that it refers to Christ and the church.

Ephesians 5:31-32

How can we Model His Unity?

- 1. We imitate His Love.
 - a. Throughout the Bible, God says when we love one another like He loves us, they become one and He becomes visible.

No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God abides in us and his love is perfected in us. I John 4:12

- 2. What does love look like?
 - a. Is patient
 - b. Is not irritable or resentful
 - c. Hopes all things
 - d. Bears all things

- e. Is not arrogant or rude
- f. Does not rejoice in wrongdoing
- g. Never ends
- h. Is kind
- i. Does not insist on its own way
- j. Endures all things
- k. Does not envy or boast
- I. Rejoices with the truth

One Minute to Oneness:

- Which traits of love in this passage are most difficult for you to imitate?
- 3. We imitate his Promise
 - a. God intended marital unity to be expressed within a covenant relationship—not a contract.

b. God's love is not based on our performance or affections for Him. He doesn't make a contract with His people, but a covenant—a permanent vow—to love unconditionally for a lifetime. In the same way, God designed marriage to reflect the same kind of commitment.

Couples who pursue unity with one another will move toward oneness.

The second purpose is to make an IMPACT on the next generation.

And God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over every living thing that moves on the earth."

Genesis 1:28 ~ MSG

- 1. Impact your world through generations that out live you: your children, grandchildren, stepchildren, adopted, foster, and children who need the most help.
 - a. Marriage is the original and unique context for children to be shaped in their thinking about critical areas of life:

- i. Who is God? What is He like?
- ii. How do relationships work? How does marriage work?
- iii. What does it mean to be a woman or a man?
- iv. Who am I/ How should I think about myself?
- v. Why am I here? What matters in life?

And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise. Deuteronomy 6:5-7

- b. Children do best with family stability.
- 2. Impact your world by tending the "garden" God placed you in with all that He has given you.

The Lord God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to work it and keep it.

Genesis 2:15

And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

Colossians 3:17

Couples who pursue impact in the world will move toward oneness.

The third purpose is to move into the world with a lifelong Companion.

It's not good for a man to be alone, I'll make him a helper, a companion.

Genesis 2:1 ~ MSG

We discover five choices from the first couple that are essential for life-long companionship.

- 1. Believe God brought you together for His purposes
 - God created Adam with a need for companionship.

The man gave names to all livestock and to the birds of the heavens and to every beast of the field. But for Adam there was not found a helper fit for him.

Genesis 2:20

God provided for Adam's need with Eve.

So the Lord God caused a deep sleep to fall upon the man, and while he slept took one of his ribs and closed up its place with flesh. And the rib that the Lord God had taken from the man he made into a woman and brought her to the man.

Genesis 2:21-22

 Marriage is God's original and unique context for life-long companionship. Regardless of how you got married or the state of your marriage, God can transform where you are and move you to oneness.

2. Receive your spouse as God's companion for you

 Adam enthusiastically received Eve because He trusted God, not because of Eve's performance.

Then the man said, "This at last is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; she shall be call Woman because she was taken out of Man.

Genesis 2:23

 That's easy on a wedding day, but like Adam and Eve, we soon discover our spouse isn't always who we imagined them to be.

WHAT MAKES IT DIFFICULT TO KEEP RECEIVING YOUR SPOUSE AS YOUR LIFE-LONG COMPANION?

- a. I never imagined how different they would be:
 - i.Gender
 - ii. Perspectives
 - iii. Temperaments
 - iv. Background
 - v. Preferences
 - vi. Roles
- b. I never imagined how selfish they would be
- c. I never imagined I would be mistreated in my marriage

While God can redeem even the hardest of marriages, mistreatment to the point of abuse is never acceptable. The most loving thing we can do for an abusive spouse is hold them accountable for their actions. Seek counsel and protection for you and your children.

3. Leave behind old ways of life (especially parents and family of origin)

Therefore shall a man leave his father and his mother, and shall cleave unto his wife: and they shall be one flesh. Genesis 2:24 ~ KJV

"Leave" means to "break dependence" on other things.

When frustrations creep into marriage, we often turn back to someone or something other than our spouse.

- i. Parents
- ii. Friends
- iii. Old habits and patterns
- iv. Children
- v. Other

4. Cleave to your spouse

Therefore, shall a man leave his father and his mother, and shall cleave unto his wife: and they shall be one flesh. Genesis 2:24 ~ KJV

• "Cleave" means to "cling to, bind, form a permanent bond."

You are not called to cleave to your work or your children, to your friends or your hobbies. Cleave reinforces the idea of making a permanent covenant with your spouse.

One Minute to Oneness:

What is your spouse competing with for your time and attention?

Work demands Hobbies

Unhealthy pursuits of wealth, career, renown Other family or friends

Social or digital media Baggage from the past

Unresolved personal issues/mental health

5. Weave together as one flesh

Therefore, a man shall leave his father and his mother and hold fast to his wife, and they will become one flesh. And they were both naked, the man and his wife, and were not ashamed.

Genesis 2:24-25 ~ KJV

- "One flesh" is not just about sex.
- God designed marriage so that there could be one person in the world with whom you are "naked" fully known and fully accepted—just like you can be with Him.
- God wants us to be "naked and unashamed"—but that can change?

Couples who pursue life-long companionship will move toward oneness.

CONTRACT RELATIONSHIP vs COVENANT RELATIONSHIP

A choice to......

Believe

We came together to make each other happy. vs God brought us together for His purpose

Receive

My spouse as long as they live up to my expectations. vs My spouse with all their imperfections.

Leave

My options open in case something goes wrong. vs The security of family/past relationships.

Cleave

To each other as long as we "feel love" for one another. vs
To each other until death do us part.

Weave

With sex as fuel for our "love." vs With sex as an expression of our covenant.

GOD ASKED THE FIRST COUPLE TO GRAB HOLD OF A BIG DREAM FOR MARRIAGE:

- 1. Model the unity of God to those around you.
- 2. Make an impact on the next generation.
- 3. Move into the world with a life-long companion.

So what happened? It didn't take long before that dream came crashing down.

Remember: Receive your spouse as God's companion for you.

 Pray that they will receive God's purposes for marriage as truth and begin to make an impact on the next generation.

.... And God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it, and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over every living thing that moves on the earth."

Every marriage will encounter three major threats to oneness.

Path to Oneness: Align against three major threats

Beware: We have an unseen enemy who doesn't want us to be one with our spouses

The Invisible Threat:

Now the serpent was more crafty than any other beast of the field

Genesis 3:1

Satan's first target was a marriage

- Since Satan couldn't harm God, he threatened God's three purpose for oneness:
 - 1. He seeks to distort God's unity in us
 - 2. He seeks to destroy God's impact on future generations
 - 3. He seeks to disrupt companionship between God and people

Stand together against a common foe

For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places.

Ephesians 6:12

Your spouse is not your enemy

The Internal Threat:

God created the first couple with the capacity to choose between God's desires and their own desires—His way or their own way.

This attitude, trusting self over God, led to what the Bible calls sin.

Sin is missing the mark of God's perfect standard.

All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned-every one-to his own way. Isaiah 53:6

For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God. Romans 3:23

When Adam and Eve trusted their own way, it created spiritual separation from God and relational separation from each other, producing:

Shame They sewed fig leaves together. (Gen. 3:7)

Guilt The man and his wife hid themselves (Gen. 3.8)

Fear I was afraid...so I hid. (Gen.3.9-10)

Blame-shifting *The woman whom you gave me...the serpent deceived me.* (Gen 3.11-14)

Battle for control *Your desire shall be for your husband, and he shall rule over you.* (Gen 3. 7-16)

The problem in marriage isn't something specific or unique to your relationship. It's that sin and selfishness go hand in hand. When there's broken connection to God and spouse, instead of trying to meet the needs of our spouse, we become fixated on meeting our own—often through counterfeits or "affairs."

- Another person physically or emotionally
- Your career and ambitions
- Your favorite activities and pursuits
- Other relationships you prioritize over your spouse
- Fantasy or pornographic material.

<u>Beware</u>: We underestimate our own contribution to what threatens our oneness.

<u>Fast Fact:</u> "Affairs" are simply an escape from reality or a search for fulfillment outside your marriage.

The External Threat:

<u>Beware</u>: We live in a broken world that devalues God's original design for oneness

Competing Philosophies

The world offers deceptive alternatives to God's design for our marriage

- Marriage is outdated and/or unnecessary
- Marriage is a contract
- Marriage is primarily about me
- Marriage is a form of control

Compelling Influencers

The world uses influential platforms to produce and promote images, ideas, and thoughts about oneness that often contradict God's design for our marriage

- Pop culture (movies/music/entertainment)
- Education system

- Print and mass media (magazines, TV talk shows, radio programs)
- Social media

In this world you will have trouble... John 16:33

Challenging Struggles

The world produces unexpected and unwanted trails that challenge God's design for our marriage

- Loss of a child
- Unemployment
- Deployment
- Health/mental issues
- Family challenges

Path to Oneness: Trust God's three sources of help

FIRST, GOD HELPS BY RESTORING OUR COMPANIONSHIP WITH HIM

1. God desires to restore companionship with his most prized creation

And they heard the sound of the Lord God walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the Lord God among the trees of the garden. But the Lord God called to the man and said to him, "Where are you?"

2. We have chosen to live independently from God

For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God. Romans 3:23

For the wages of sin is death... Romans 6:23

3. God sent his son Jesus to restore our companionship with God. He lived. He died. He rose again.

But God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners,

Christ died for us.

Romans 5:8

That he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures I Corinthians 15:4

4. We all have an opportunity to receive God's gift of oneness with Him.

For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord. Romans 6:23

But to all who did receive him, who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God. John 1:12

Receive God's Good News (the Gospel)

For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life.

John 3:16

Believe God loves you and sent his son Jesus to live, die, and rise again on your behalf.

Leave or repent of your independence (sin) from God.

Cleave to God and connect with others who follow Jesus.

Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me."

The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life and have it abundantly.

John 10:10

<u>Warning</u>: Oneness with God should not be motivated primarily by a desire for personal happiness, a trouble-free life, or a great marriage.

Good news for your marriage

- When oneness in your marriage feels threatened, go to God first.
- Oneness with your spouse is possible; there's no such thing as a hopeless marriage.
- Oneness grows as we live out the example of sacrificial love daily.
- Jesus has given us power to love imperfect people unconditionally.

SECOND, GOD HELPS BY EMPOWERING US WITH HIS SPIRIT

So I say, let the Holy Spirit guide your lives. Then you won't be doing what your sinful nature craves.

Galatians 5:16 ~ NLT

1. God asks us to love our spouse (and others) in ways that don't come naturally:

Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths. Ephesians 4:29

Do not repay evil for evil...but on the contrary, bless. I Peter 3:9

Be angry and do not sin. Ephesians 4:26

...forgiving each other, as the Lord has forgiven you. Colossians 3:13

2. God sent the Holy Spirit to help us

But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name... John 14:26

- Follow Jesus wherever He leads us.
- See the sin in our own life.
- Forgive the sin in others.
- Love imperfect people like He does
- Do the right thing in the right way.

3. God wants us to develop new habits to help us be more conscious of the Spirit's presence in our life.

Rather train yourself for godliness; for while bodily training is of some value, godliness is of value in every way, as it holds promise for the present life and also for the life to come.

THIRD, GOD HELPS BY ENCOURAGING US THROUGH OTHERS WHO FOLLOW JESUS

1. Jesus, the Son of God, started His journey with others

And he appointed twelve (who he also named apostles) so that they might be with him...

2. One reason God created the church was so that we wouldn't journey alone

And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near.

3. Join other couples on the journey to oneness

Therefore encourage one another and build one another up, just as you are doing.

I Thessalonians 5:11

4. Trained counselors can help us figure out what's going on in our hearts.

5. FamilyLife wants to walk with you.

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DO YOU NEED TO RESET WITH GOD?

Path to Oneness: Honor one another on life's journey

 Pray for couples to be able to share an area in their marriage where they need more help from the Holy Spirit, as they do the *One Minute to* Oneness exercise.

The Spirit of God not only maintains this hope within us, but helps us in our present limitations. For example, we do not know how to pray worthily as sons of God, but his Spirit within us is actually praying for us in those agonizing longings which never find words. And God who knows the heart's secrets understands, of course, the Spirit's intention as he prays for those who love God.

 Pray that the couples would be encouraged through others who follow Jesus.

And he appointed twelve (whom he also named apostles) so that they might be with him

Ask for Forgiveness: Learn to Apologize

1. NAME IT

Discover your attitude behind the action.

4. SAY IT

Say "I'm sorry" (with no buts!) and Ask them to forgive you.

5. CHANGE IT

Suggest a few ways you will change (repent).

Daring question: Where do I need the most work?

Grant Forgiveness: Learn to Set Free

❖ Overlook

❖ Remove Immediately

Good sense makes one slow to anger, and it is his glory to overlook an offense. Proverbs 19:11

❖ Resolve Quickly

- 1. If they apologize, express gratitude and move toward forgiveness.
- 2. You bring it up.
- 3. Approach with humility.
- 4. Be generous—no stingy forgivers.
- 5. Box it up and move on.

❖ Deal With

❖ Restore Patiently

- 1. Trust isn't restored automatically.
- 2. Both spouses are involved in healing.
- 3. There's wisdom in seeking help.
- 4. Some offenses require more than an apology. They require accountability.
- 5. There is hope—take a step at a time.

❖ Rebuild Trust

Warning:

- Your partner won't always apologize.
- Your toughest and most frequent arguments will be when both of you are right.
- Your emotions don't always follow the script.

One Minute to Oneness:

❖ Picture a box with a lid. The box is an apology, and the lid is forgiveness. Pick one issue that can be dealt with and resolved this weekend.

A SATISFYING LOVE LIFE IS MADE UP OF FOUR INGREDIENTS:

1. Companionship: Are we pursuing one another?

When companionship is lacking,

sex often loses its depth.

COMMUNICATION:

share openly, listen carefully

TENDERNESS:

give creative expression of affection, show your love through non-sexual touch

SPEND TIME TOGETHER:

share mutual interests, revive the lost art of dating

2. Commitment: Are we instilling trust? When commitment is lacking, sex can seem risky and can leave a spouse feeling vulnerable

FAITHFULNESS:

regularly affirm your commitment, build or rebuild trust, develop a healthy attitude toward your spouse

RESPECT:

be a good listener, validate each other's perspectives and opinions, never condescend or talk down to each other, be open to each other's desires

FORGIVENESS:

keep short accounts with each other, choose to live in the power of blessing, remember: "love covers a multitude of sins," give grace when needed

3. Passion: Are we romancing each other?

When passion is lacking,

sex can become routine and stale.

PLANNING:

make it a priority, schedule it for the best part of your day

CREATIVITY:

enhance the setting, vary the approach

4. Spiritual Intimacy: Are we pursuing God together?

When spiritual intimacy is lacking,

sex can become shallow and self-focused.

PRAYER:

pray together as a couple, pray for each other regularly

THE BIBLE:

spend time reading the bible together, find verses or passages you can memorize together

Project 2:

It's not about *being* a perfect man, but *following* a perfect man

LOVE YOUR WIFE BY SUBMITTING TO GOD'S ROLE

Submit to one another out of reverence for Christ. Wives, submit to your own husbands, as to the Lord. For the husband is the head of the wife even as Christ is the head of the church, his body, and is himself its Savior.

Ephesians 5:21-23

While created with equal value, husbands and wives have different roles in marriage.

- The Bible speaks about two unique roles in marriage:
 Headship (Eph. 5:23) and Submission (Gen. 2:18)
- We often misunderstand or even abuse the biblical concepts of headship and submission. Think of headship as stewardship and a willing choice to sacrificially serve. Think of submission as a willing choice to support someone's leadership.
- Men: Jesus modeled that leading has more to do with serving than dominance or priority (Mark 10:42-45)
- Women: Helper is a title of worth. God refers to himself as a Helper (Psalms 33:20)

Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her. Ephesians.5:25

Biblical headship does not mean:

- Your wife is inferior or has a loss of identity
- Your wife blindly obeys or submits to any mistreatment
- Your wife follows you into sin

Biblical headship means:

- Submitting yourself to God's leadership in your home
- Sacrificially serving your wife like Jesus served the Church
- Seeking unity with your wife on decisions and direction

PRACTICAL WAYS TO DEMONSTRATE SERVING

Needs

- Conflict
- Finances

- Spiritual growth
- Chores
- Trust

You know that those who are considered rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones exercise authority over them. But it shall not be so among you. LOVE YOUR WIFE BY NOURISHING AND CHERISHING HER

LOVE YOUR HUSBAND BY RESPECTING HIM

Respect is a choice to receive your husband in spite of his weaknesses

However, let each of you love his wife as himself, and let the wife see that she respects her husband. Ephesians 5:33

Respect looks like:

- A heart attitude of unconditional respect
- Noticing the good things he does and saying, "Thank you"
- Showing appreciation for his desire to provide for you and your family

Respect does not look like:

- Excusing sinful behavior
- Criticizing or correcting your husband in public
- Feeling you can't disagree or have differing opinions with him

LOVE YOUR HUSBAND BY SUPPORTING HIM

Submit to one another out of reverence for Christ. Wives, submit to you own husbands, as to the Lord. For the husband is the head of the wife even as Christ is the head of the church, his body, and is himself its Savior.

Ephesians 5:21-21

There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is neither male nor female, for you are all one in Christ. Galatians 3:28

While created with equal value, husbands and wives have different roles in marriage

- The Bible speaks about two unique roles in marriage:
 Headship (Eph. 5:23) and Submission. (Gen. 2:18)
- We often misunderstand or even abuse the biblical concepts of headship and submission. Think of headship as stewardship and a willing choice to sacrificially serve. Think of submission as a willing choice to support someone's leadership.
- Men: Jesus modeled that leading has more to do with serving than dominance or priority. (Mark 10:42-45)
- Women: Helper is a title of worth. God refers to himself as a Helper. (Psalms 33:20)

Biblical submission does not mean:

- You are inferior or lose your identity
- You blindly obey or submit to verbal or physical mistreatment
- You follow your husband into sin

Biblical submission does mean:

- Giving up your desire to control
- Viewing support as a complimentary and not competitive way of relating to your husband
- Cooperating with your husband as he seeks to lead your marriage and family

 - Positivity Affirmation

LOVE YOUR HUSBAND BY PARTNERING TOGETHER TO IMPACT THE NEXT GENERATION

- Internationally partner with your husband to raise your kids

Prayer Directives and Scriptures

One Minute to Explain Oneness:

 Pray for couples to desire to be one and to be connected.

We also pray that you will be strengthened with all his glorious power so you will have all the endurance and patience you need. May you be filled with joy.

Project 3: God's Plan for the Dream (Love Letter)

- Pray for each one to spend time praying confessing and forgiving one another.
- Pray as they each answer the question in the form of a Love Letter.
- Pray as they get back together and share their feelings and commitment with each other.

INTERCESSION

The greatest intercessor is Jesus. He lives to intercede.

All believers are called to pray and intercede. Regarding prayer, we are to follow Christ's character. Christ would go away and pray for an entire night. He would intercede for everyone. "He [Christ] always lives to make intercession for them" (Hebrews 7:25 NASB).

Not all prayer is intercession. Most people offer prayers of petition. True intercession includes seeking the heart of God in particular situations, listening for discernment from the Holy Spirit about how to pray, asking God for divine intervention, and for destroying the works of Satan.

Definitions for Intercede/Intercession:

- Intercede (from Webster) is "to go or pass between; to act between parties with a view to reconcile those who differ or contend; to interpose; to mediate or make intercession; mediation."
- · A summarization of this definition by Dutch Sheets is "mediating, going between, pleading for another, representing one party to another for, but not limited to, legal situations."²
- The Hebrew word used for intercession is "paga." "Paga" means to meet. Intercessors meet with God; they also meet the powers of darkness. We meet with Him asking Him to meet with someone else. We become the go-between: "Heavenly Father, I come to you today (a meeting) asking you to touch Tom (another meeting)." On the opposite end of the spectrum, as Christ did through spiritual warfare, our meeting with the enemy is to undo a meeting—breaking, a severing, a disuniting" (Sheets, p.50).

When we think of interceding for others, we can use the Scriptures to "weep with those who weep" and "bear one another's burdens" (Romans 12:15; Galatians 6:2 NASB). Two Greek words used for bearing are "anechomai" and "bastazo." "Anechomai" means to sustain, bear, or hold up against a thing. (Think of a tomato plant staked to sustain it's weight.) "Bastazo" means to bear, lift, or carry with the idea being to carry away or remove it. So intercession is "paga": He "lays on" us

someone else's need. "Anechomai": We "stake" ourselves to that person. "Bastazo": We "carry away" the weakness or burden (Sheets, p.70).

Humanity needs Christ's intercession, which is to go between God and us and reconcile us to God. We need Christ to go between Satan and us and to separate us from him. Our prayers of intercession are an extension of Jesus' work of intercession.
